






Africa has a variety of climate zones, from tropical to


They converted to Christianity and then to Islam



- Axum controlled <u>trade</u> among Africa,
 India, & the Mediterranean
- They used sailing ships called <u>dhows</u> to expand trade in the Red Sea & the <u>Indian Ocean</u>
- They traded <u>ivory</u>, tortoise shells, gold, emeralds, <u>silk</u> & <u>spices</u>

GHANA


- Ghana thrived from the 800s to 1100's
- Islam was introduced to Ghana by Muslim merchants
- The King collected taxes from controlling the Gold-Salt Trade

Zimbabwe thrived in Southern
Africa from 700 to 1450






ZIMBABWE
