



 - Traders traded cotton cloth, grain, copper, bronze pearls, & ivory in cities






- Polytheistic believed in many gods

 - Possible invasion by Aryans


The Decline of Harappa




The Aryans migrate into India through the Khyber Pass around 1750 BC

They begin the Vedic Age based on the Vedas






The Vedas is the oldest scriptures of Hinduism
