



#### The Arabian Reninsula

- Mostly <u>desert</u> & most people who live there are <u>nomadic</u>
- By the early 600s, many <u>Arabs</u> settled in an oasis or market town

#### The Arabian Reninsula

- Permanent trade routes develop between the Byzantine and Persian Empires & along the Silk Roads
- They traded <u>spices</u>, incense, silk, and other products
- · Camels were used to transport goods



#### The Arabian Peninsula

 The city of <u>Mecca</u> was along the trade routes

Traders would stop at the Ka'aba, adding idols to be worshipped along with many gods and spirits

#### The Arabian Reninsula

- Monotheistic religions also existed in the area
  - Arabic Christians and Jews worshiped one God
- God = <u>Allah</u> (Arabic) = <u>Eluhim</u> (Hebrew) = <u>El</u> (Aramaic)



## Milhammaa

- He was born in <u>Mecca</u> around 570; little is known of his early life
- He had no formal education



## Milhaminach

- Muhammad became distressed with the <u>idol</u> worship of Arabs, so he began to fast and <u>meditate</u> about the fate of his people
- At the age of 40, Muhammad heard the voice of the Angel Gabriel telling him that there was only one Lord, Allah
- Muhammad believed he was the last and the greatest in a series of prophets
  - Starting 1st with Abraham and including Moses & Jesus

## LOVANAMIC A ELIGIONS



- Muhammad is a descendant of <u>Abraham</u>, and his beliefs are based on Abraham's prophecy
- Judaism, Christianity, and Islam are all <u>Abrahamic</u> faiths, and their "God" is the same

# Muiharninad Sprädis Islam

- Muhammad began to <u>preach</u> Islam in 613 but was met with hostility and rejection in Mecca
- Many thought it would <u>hurt</u> Mecca as a <u>trading</u> and pilgrimage center
- Muhammad left Mecca in 622 and began the Hijra, or "flight" to Medina

# Milhammad Spréads Islam

- In <u>Medina</u>, Muhammad joined Arabs, Muslims and Jews together into one community, or "umma" and served them as a political, religious and military leader
- Many Meccans converted to Islam and joined the <u>umma</u>.

# Milhaminad Sprédis Islami

- Muhammad dies 2 years later in 632 at age 62
- After his death, Muhammad's revelations were written in Arabic and collected the <u>Qu'ran</u>

# The Spread of Islami 632-750





- The Qu'ran is the holy book of the Muslims, seen as a sequel to the Torah and Gospels
- Arabic is the language of the Qu'ran, and only Arabic is the true word of Allah

# The Muslim Way of Life


- Muslims may not drink alcohol or eat pork
- There is no <u>priests</u> or central religious authority (An exception is in Shia Islam)
- People worship Allah directly

# The Muslim Way of Life

- Ulama scholar class of religious teachers who apply Muhammad's teachings to everyday life
- Muslims must follow the Five Pillars




- Daily Prayer
- Alms to the poor
- Fasting during Ramadan
- Hajj: a <u>pilgrimage</u> to Mecca


