






THE WARRING STATES

- Powerless emperors were controlled by shoguns (military leaders)
- Struggled to keep weak Japan unified
- 1400-1500's
- Samurais seized control of estates & offer peasants protection for loyalty
- The strongest samurais became Daimyo (warrior-chieftains)



#### THE WARRING STATES PERIOD

- Powerful Daimyo included -
- ODA NOBUNAGA seized
  Japan's capital Kyoto in 1568
  & pushes out all rivals with
  force 1575 uses firearms
  for 1st time in Japan
- TOYOTOMI HIDEYOSHI gains control of country by 1590 & invades Korea in 1592




## TOKUGRWA IESASU

- A daimyo he wins a decisive victory in the Battle of Sekigahara in 1600
- He eventually unifies
   Japan gains loyalty of all daimyo
- Becomes shogun sole ruler and the "Tokugawa Shogunate" begins






## EFFECTS ON JAPAN

- Brings stability, prosperity, & isolation
- Food production increases
- Japan's population increases
- Merchant class becomes wealthy & powerful, but peasants remain poor & overworked

 Mid-1700s Japan shifts from rural to urban society - Edo was world's largest city







# CITTY CULTURE

## HRRIVAL OF

- Japanese eager to trade w/ Portuguese: modern goods, tobacco, & firearms
- Missionaries want to convert people BUT the Shogunate believed they looked down on Japanese culture & religion
- Missionaries are banned & Christians are persecuted
- All Japanese ports closed except Nagasaki



## JAPAN FORCED OPEN



- Commodore Matthew Perry of the US arrived in Japan with a fleet of steam ships in 1853
- Threatens Tokyo with force
- Japan forced open to the West with the Convention of Kanagawa in 1854

# FALL OF THE TOKUGAWA SHOTZINETE


- Many nobles unhappy with the Shogunate's handling of foreigners
- Increasing Western influence in the economy hurts many
- An alliance of western samurai, gain influence with the young Emperor Meiji
- Civil War erupts in 1868





Samurai of the Satsuma domain, fighting for the Imperial side during Civil War.


## BATTLE OF LIENO



The Battle of Ueno was the final encounter leading to the complete fall of Edo (modern Tokyo).

## THE MEIJI RESTORATION

- The Imperial side is victorious and drives Tokugawa out of Tokyo in 1868
- Japan returns to imperial rule by Emperor Meiji
- Plan for modernization set out in the Charter Oath
- The Meiji Period begins
