 - O Jews: Zion, God's own city,
 site of Solomon's temple
 - Muslims: 3rd holiest city, where Muhammad ascended to heaven






HE CRUSADES

Crusaders "take up the cross" to recover the Holy Land from Muslims It was a series of nine military expeditions between Muslims and Christians

THE CRUSADES

Muslim Turks captured Jerusalem from the Byzantine Empire

Muslims stopped Christians from Visiting Holy Land

Christian pilgrims were attacked

Byzantine Empire feared attack on Constantinople

Why Go on a Crusade?

- <u>Knights</u>: use fighting skills, go on an adventure
- Gain possible wealth or instant <u>salvation</u> if killed in battle


• <u>Peasants</u>: gain freedom from feudal bonds

• The Pope wanted to increase the church's <u>power</u> in Europe



THE SECOND CRUSADE


- 1147 1149
- After victory, manyChristians went home
- The Turks (Muslims) <u>take</u>
 <u>back</u> much of the
 conquered territory
- The King of France and <u>Germany</u> sent troops to stop the Turks



Path of the Second Crusade




- <u>1189 1192</u>
- Led by <u>Richard the</u> **Lionheart** of England
- Saladin united Muslims, took Jerusalem in 1187
- Saladin's <u>truce</u> he keeps city, but allows **Christian** pilgrims access to the Holy Land



THE FOURTH CRUSADE

- <u>1204</u>
- Crusaders decide not to go to <u>Jerusalem</u>
- Attack Christian city of <u>Constantinople</u> instead




More Crusades

- Several more <u>crusades</u>
 attempted with no victories
 for the Christians
- 1212 Children's crusade,
- <u>30,000</u> soldiers many of them under 12 years old
- They <u>never</u> made it to the Holy Land



EFFECTS OF THE CRUSADES

- Feudalism breaks down lords either died or spent too much money on the war
- <u>Bitterness</u> among Muslims, Christians, and Jews grows
- <u>Turks</u> still rule the Holy Lands



THE RECONQUISTA

- King Ferdinand and Queen Isabella of Spain wanted to create a Christian Spain
- They attempt to drive all <u>Muslims</u> out of Spain




THE RECONQUISTA


 More than <u>150,000</u> people fled Spain in fear

- Religious <u>unity</u> was achieved in Spain, but at a huge price
- Spain's <u>economy</u> suffered from loss of many skilled and <u>educated</u> people
