Development of a New Political Party





- Got super involved

 - NAZI Party


Nazi Party Platform

- Take back economy










Manji vs. Swastika

- Signals obedience to Hitler
 - Means "Hitler, my leader"
- Mandatory for all citizens to give the salute
- currently a criminal offense in Germany, the Czech Republic, Slovakia, and Austria

Beer Hall Putsch

- Oct 30, 1923
- Held a rally
 - Declared revolution
- Failed in the overthrow
 - Hitler imprisoned



- At his trial, spoke about Nazism
 - Spread popularity
- Served 9 months
 - Wrote "Mein Kampf"
- More determined than ever
